A. Read some more information on the Black Sea, from the same sources:

In antiquity, the ancient Greeks used to call the Black Sea the 'Hospitable sea', *Euxeinus Pontos* (Εὐξεινος Πόντος). But this was a euphemism, in order to reverse the fact that the sea was difficult to navigate, due to frequent storms and because its shores were inhabited by savage tribes.

Today, all the peoples surrounding this deep water basin, call it by a name meaning “**Black Sea**” in their own language. (In the brackets you can see the original writing in the alphabet of the languages that do not use the Latin letters. The bold letters indicate where the stress is.
